Program introduction

Orientation and Welcome Dinner

Opening

Laboratory Tour

Dinner with Professors

We are going to invite NTU professors to have dinner with delegates, providing delegates an opportunity to talk to professors.

Seminars

There will be at least two seminars throughout the camp period. Topics could be science and technology related or about economics. Professors of National Taiwan University and experts from government and well-known companies will be invited to join the seminars as instructors, to give speech and share experience with delegates. Participants will exchange their own perspectives and views. We will put emphasis on the interaction between instructors and delegates.

Firm Visiting

Delegates can understand the companies' operation and industry by visiting firms. Talk between company managers and delegates will be arranged.

Sightseeing

Taipei City Tour

Taipei is Taiwan's largest city as well as its economic, political, and cultural center. It is a modern cosmopolitan metropolis with a lively and diversified face, filled with exuberance. Its buildings provide much of the diversity. Taipei has the



world's tallest building **Taipei 101**, and delegates who are fond of historic sites and old streets will not want to miss the work of traditional master builders evident on Dihua Street in the Dadaocheng area or the Longshan Temple in the Wanhus district, as well as other places. We will visit the internationally renowned **National Palace Museum** which has an inexhaustible collection of precious historical Chinese arts and artifacts. On the city's outskirts, the **Yangmingshan National Park** has unique volcanic terrain, a rich variety of forest vegetation, and an extensive network of hiking trails, making it a popular destination for visitors from the Taipei area and elsewhere. Yangmingshan is also the place where we plan to visit.

Hsinchu City

Taiwan's the other AEARU member TsingHua University is right located in Hsinchu City. The town of Hsinchu is famous for its Science-based Industrial Park. It has gained considerable prosperity and an international reputation since the creation of the Hsinchu Science-based industrial Park.

Nantou County

Nantou County lies at the geographical heart of Taiwan and is the only county that does not border the coast. Nantou covers an area of 410 square kilometers of mainly mountainous country. The county's abundant natural beauty makes it an excellent place for sightseeing. The area is blessed with a number of interesting towns, forested mountain, and clear streams at Shitou, Shanlinshi, Sun Moon Lake, and the Formosan Aboriginal Culture Village. In Nantou, we expect delegates can see glamorous scenery and experience aborigine's culture.

Talent Show

This is the time for delegates to give a performance and show themselves. All kinds of performance will be encouraged.

Ball – The dancing party

This is an official dancing party. All participants have to wear suit or pantsuit. Gentlemen should invite ladies dance. Meanwhile, there will be performance on stage.
