IV. REVIEW OF WORKSHOPS, MEETINGS AND STUDENT SUMMER CAMPS TO BE HELD IN 2005

1. 1st Student Physical Game-Futsal Game, Tsinghua University

There was some discussions with regards to the elimination of the robot games. Secretary Zhengkai ZHOU, mentioned that only KAIST had responded to the request for comments, so the games had been dropped

from the camp. Mr. Robert B. LAUGHLIN mentioned that KAIST and POSTECH had held a similar event, and the students had arranged for a musical performance after the games that had been very successful.

2. Students Summer Camp (General), July 24-30, 2005 Hong Kong University of Science and Technology

Invitations have been sent out to the member Universities and the theme of the camp will be Peace, Trust and Balance in Asia. Speakers have been invited. Closing date for registration was May 11th, 2005.

3. Students Summer Camp (Topical), August 15-21, 2005, Tsinghua University-Hsinchu

The invitations have been sent to the member universities and things are proceeding on schedule.

 AEARU and APRU Joint Symposium on Earthquake Hazards around the Pacific Rim - Prediction and Disaster Prevention, August 31-Sept. 2, 2005

Kyoto will host this symposium. The purpose of the meeting will be to share information and knowledge on seismology to help mitigate damage from future earthquakes. President Kazuo OIKE also shared information and film footage on the recent earthquake. As East Asia is at the center of most seismographic activity in the world this is a very important issue for all AEARU member universities.

5. 11th General Meeting and 17th Board of Directors Meeting, August 7-9, 2005, Fudan University

The meeting will coincide with the centennial anniversary of the university. All the Member university Presidents have responded except the Tokyo University President who will not be able to attend because of another meeting in the UK.

6. International Conference on Traditions of Controversy East & West, Taiwan University

The original date for this conference has been rescheduled to take place on July 20-23, 2005.

7. 6th Workshop on Web Technology & Computer Science, POSTECH

This meeting has been scheduled for October 6-7 2005, and the plans are progressing.

8. 3rd Workshop on Network Education, Seoul National University

Despite changes in personnel at Seoul National University, the workshop will be held as planned.

9. 2nd Workshop on Advanced Materials Research, Nanjing University

This workshop is still in the planning stages by the university and they are in the process of inviting speakers. Announcements will go out to AEARU member universities once the speakers have been confirmed. The tentative date for the workshop is November 30th - December 1st, 2005.

10. 7th Molecular Biology and Biotechnology Workshop, Tsinghua University-Beijing

This workshop is scheduled to be held between September 19-21 2005.

President Robert B. LAUGHLIN mentioned that one of his goals is to increase the communication value of the workshops and social events. He asks everyone to think about how to turn the activities into something bigger and how AEARU members might use technology to extend the benefits of these meetings.

V. MATTERS ARISNG FROM THE 10TH AGM AND 15TH BOD

A. Next Edition of AEARU Printed Brochure

The brochure will be updated to reflect the changes in membership.

the last brochure was published two years ago. The secretary will be contacting each university to get up-to-date information about their university. The brochures will be available by the end of this year, each university will be able to order as many copies as the need and will be charged accordingly. The brochure provides a brief introduction to students about the AEARU universities and activities.

B. <u>Issue of KTH's (Royal Institute of Technology of Sweden)</u> application for associate membership

In general it was agreed that associate memberships with Universities from other parts of the world was favorable for several reasons. There was a lengthy discussion regarding the terms on which associate members would be admitted.

It was suggested that perhaps associate members would be charged a fee. The general feeling was that this would conflict with the Asian cultural concept of hospitality. The point was made that perhaps it was more important for the organization to function on business principles rather than social. It was agreed that a decision would be postponed and the issue would be addressed at the next General meeting.

VI. ISSUE OF AEARU VICE-CHAIRPERSONSHIP

President Laughlin will not be able to take on the role of Vice Chairperson. According to AEARU guidelines the Vice-Chairperson should also be a BOD member. It was agreed that the new vice-chairperson should come from a Korean University. President Laughlin agreed to speak to the other two Korean universities about accepting the position. The board will agreed to the decision made by the Korean Universities and will announce the decision at the next general meeting in August.
