MEETING MINUTES

I. INTRODUCTION REMARKS

He also reminded that there will be possibility for nominating new members in the next AGM meeting as our Constitution has been amended.

President Satomi greeted all assembled members and thanked everyone for coming. He stated that he honored to be a member of AEARU and to host this meeting.

The Chairperson invited Prof. Chung-min Chen, Tsing Hua University-Hsinchu, to go through the meeting agenda.

II. CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES

1. Minute of the 31st BOD meeting; November 2, 2012; Seoul National University, Korea

Prof. Chung-min Chen stated that the minute has been circulated to all members prior to the meeting. The Chairperson corrected a spelling on Page 6 Line 3, "cot" to "cost". With no further suggestion and amendment the minute was confirmed.

III. SECRETARY REPORT

1. Financial status

The AEARU Secretary reported that all membership fees for the year 2013 had all been collected, and with no expenses except for 55 dollars bank charge, the Association has a surplus of USD\$33,956. Added the surplus to carry over of USD \$44359.92 from last period, the AEARU account has total of USD \$78304.92 in balance.

IV. ISSUES TO BE DISCUSSED

 AEARU Activity Sponsorship Program – activity proposals selection and funding approval Nanjing University applied for USD \$10,000 to support the 4th Science and Technology Parks Workshop, which will be held on September 20-21, 2013.

President Chen Jun of Nanjing University reported briefly about the activity and explained the intension for the use of the funding. With no objection from the Board Members, the Chairperson approved the application.

Hong Kong University of Science and Technology applied for USD \$10,000 to host the 5th AEARU Advanced Material Workshop between November 19-20, 2013.

Prof. Kar Yan Tam of Hong Kong University of Science and Technology reported on the funding proposal and invited all members to participate. He further explained the use of funding. With no objection from the Board Members, the Chairperson approved the application.

Korea Advanced Institute of Science and Technology applied for USD \$10,000 to host AEARU 2013 Symposium on Smart and Resilient Growth (SRG) of Asian Cities.

The AEARU Secretary reported the application on behalf of Korea Advanced Institute of Science and Technology and explained the use of funding. With no further objection, the Chairperson approved the application.

V. DATES AND VENUES FOR FUTURE MEETINGS

The Chairperson stated that the 33rd BOD and 19th AGM meetings will be held in Tsing Hua University – Hsinchu, Taiwan. However, the venue for 34th BOD meeting hasn't been decided yet. The Chairperson opened the floor for suggestion.

Prof. Qiang Li of Peking University volunteered Peking University to host the 37th BOD and 20th AGM meeting in Fall 2015 in conjunction with the 3rd Symposium on the Culture of Chinese Characters. The Chairperson thanked Prof. Li for his kind support for AEARU.

Prof. Kar Yan Tam of Hong Kong University of Science and Technology stated that he will report this issue to his President and will get back to the Board Members as soon as he can regarding to the possibility of hosting the 34th BOD meeting.

The Chairperson stated that the association understands the difficulty for the member

university from Hong Kong region to host meetings, because there is only one member from the area. However, according to the record of previous meetings and venues, it is about time for Hong Kong University of Science and Technology to host next BOD meeting. The Chairperson thanked Prof. Tam for his effort.

VI. ADJOURNMENT





Purpose of activity:

With deepening of reform on science and technology and education, local governments and universities in China have paid closer attention to the development of university S&T parks. The three-level system (National-, Provincial- and University-Level) has been constructed. It is estimated that 86 national-level university S&T parks have been approved, located in 24 provinces, autonomous regions, and municipalities directly under the Central Government and in 134 universities.

It is expected that successful experiences of S&T Park development could be shared at this workshop among AEARU member universities. In the meanwhile, common problems and suggested solutions during the process are to be discussed. More importantly, in-depth exchanges of ideas on future trends including more mutually-beneficial interaction with universities and the establishment of association of world university S&T parks will be done.

Application for AEARU Funding Support for The 5th AEARU Advanced Material Workshop (2013)

Date of Activity:

19-20 December 2013

Outline of Activity:

The goal of this advanced materials workshop is to enable exchanges and foster the development of closer collaboration in four central themes of material researches. These themes are of special importance and relevance in Asia for AEARU member institutions. Sessions with themes focusing on aerospace, materials and manufacturing; nanomaterials for energy storage and conversion; biomolecules and environmental research will be organized.

The workshop will include invited talks, poster sessions and banquet with prize presentation.

Intended Use of Funding:

The workshop organizer aims to invite member institutions to nominate Ph.D. students to present their work at the workshop to foster and enable exchanges and collaborations at the student level, and develop these exchanges into enduring collaborations between AEARU institutions. The workshop organizer is seeking funding support of USD10,000 to help deflate the accommodation costs for students. Up to two nights of accommodation assistance will be granted with the provided AEARU funding for selected students. An AEARU prize for the best student paper will be given.
